SOME INFORMATION ABOUT RESIDENCIES

ARRIVAL AND ACCOMODATION

The accommodation for residents is located in a house in the village of Celrà, Carrer Jacint Verdaguer 3.

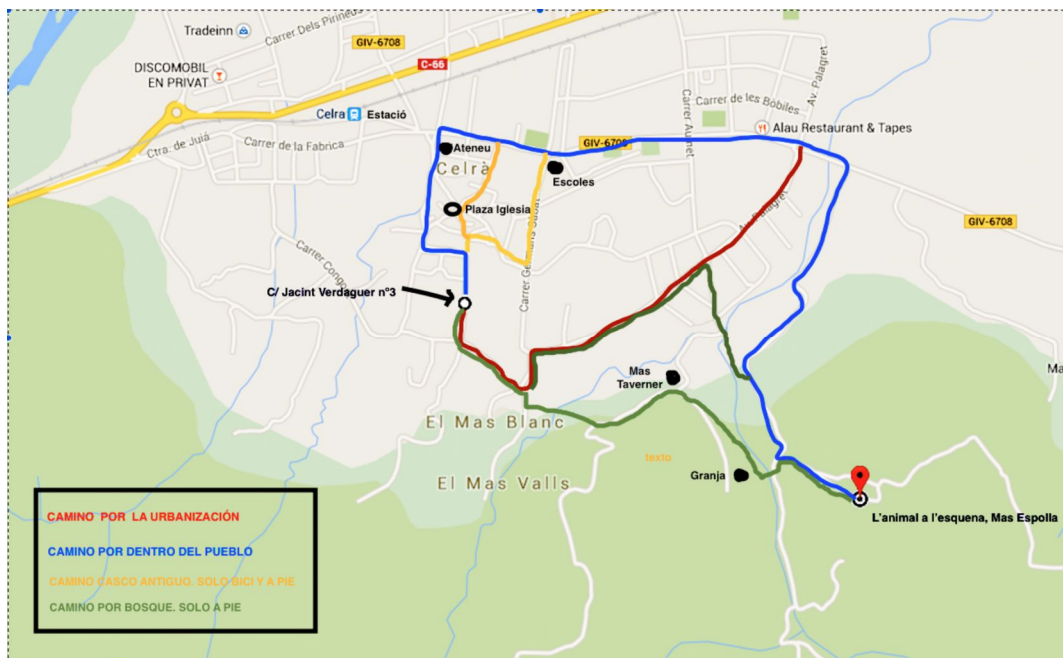
It has four rooms, two with double beds, one with two single beds and one single. Sheets, towels and blankets are provided.

The house has Internet access.

A member of the team who deals with logistics for residents will give you the information you need about shops and other facilities in the village.

L'animal a l'esquena is about 2 kilometres from the village.

You will have to arrange for your own daily transport. We do not have a vehicle for residents. If you do not have your own vehicle, we shall have to discuss what to do about daily transport. We have some bicycles at your disposal.



Residents are responsible for their own food, organisation and expenses.
In the house there is a kitchen.

The hall-studio is equipped with a fridge and microwave. It is not permitted to cook in the hall. We ask you to keep the food storage area clean.

In the farmhouse there is a butane stove, a fridge and basic cooking utensils. We ask you to keep the food storage area clean and tidy.

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND TIMETABLES

You can make use of the space all day, at whatever times you like. We shall give you the keys and explain to you about opening, closing, use of heating and electricity.

We usually offer two sessions of technical assistance, a short one at the start of the residency to set up the space according to your basic needs and another the day of your open doors performance. It is the day you can share your experience as you choose and an opportunity to talk about it.

We shall send you a sheet of technical specifications for the studio at L'animal. It is important that you get in touch with us to tell us your basic needs and decide on the day for the first technical assistance. Then we will contact the technical director, August Viladomat of the Punt de Fuga team, who will talk you through any queries you may have about the equipment we provide. Sometimes, when the setup of the space is simple and we know about it in advance, we can leave the space ready when we pack up after the previous residency.

DOCUMENTING THE RESIDENCY

Leo Castro is in charge of documentation and will get in touch with you to arrange a time to interview you and while she is at it, if you like, record footage of a session, according to what you agree with her. She is also responsible for recording the open doors performance.
